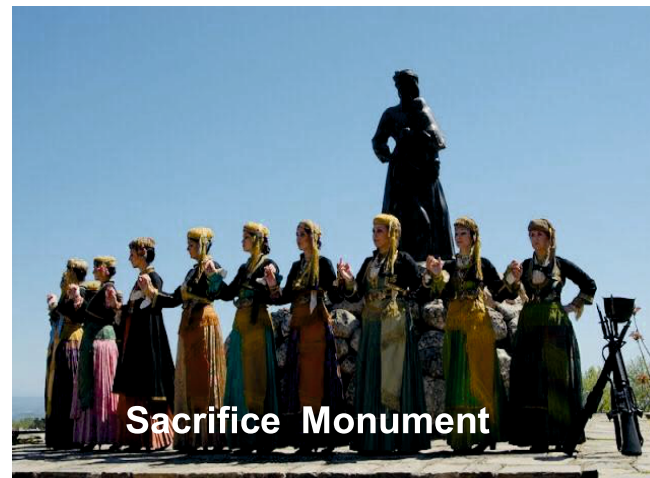

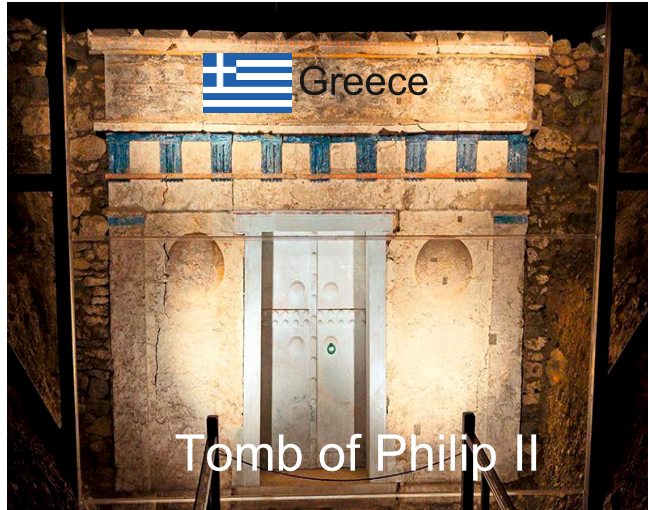

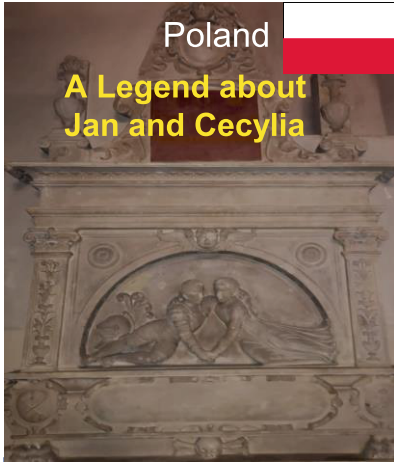
Naoussa

May is the month in which Aveiro celebrates its patron saint, Princess Joan. It is a month full of festivities and that culminates on the city's procession on May 12. Another highlight of the city is its most popular delicacy, 'ovos moles', a sweet made of water, sugar and egg yolk. It is a traditional conventual sweet originated in the ancient Convent of Aveiro (currently the city museum). Another famous sweet from the city of Aveiro are the 'cavacas', a sweet made of flour, sugar and eggs.
